


Oxford Medical Handbooks Online

Also included will be an explanation of the wider resources which can be accessed via NICE Evidence e.g. the eBNF.

An overview of how to access and use this point of care tool which provides evidence


summaries on approximately 4,000 clinical topics. The session will explain how to access it from any computer, smart phone or tablet.
