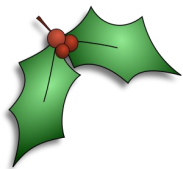

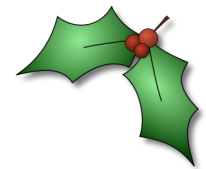

It may be that mobile devices complemented, rather than supplanted, traditional computers... This study is limited to the study of one individual, and therefore the interpretation of the results is limited...]

[Conclusion: Telecommuting offers a viable alternative to the traditional model of centralised teaching requiring trainees to commute and attend sessions in person. Using a live and interactive video link maintains the quality of the teaching session while eliminating unnecessary travel and its negative effects on mental and physical well-being. With a low cost to implement, this study demonstrates the significant monetary and environmental cost savings telecommuting can offer.]
